45th International FICE Congress 2002, September 17-21, Berlin, Germany

The 45th International FICE (Fédération Internationale des Communautés Educatives) Congress will be held in Berlin, Germany, 17-21 September, 2002, at "Haus der Kulturen der Welt" in Berlin-Tiergarten.
