(unequal pay, sex-role stereotyping in broadcasting, discrimination against aboriginal women and Canada's Charter of Rights. A climate change activist, she is co-founder of JustEarth: A Coalition for Environmental Justice, and sits on the Board of Directors of Climate Action Network, Canada. She has published extensively on women theorists, the environment, political sociology and criminology.
